



Basic Concept of RBA to Development

The **rights-based approach** first and foremost involves enhancing the realization of rights at all levels, both the powerless and the powerful. RBA training is an essential asset for those who engage in promoting and programming RBA in the organization. This training is the outcome from many years working on community based and integrated approach, participatory development, people empowerment, grassroots advocacy and rights based approach programming. It emphasizes on important programming implications inherent in the human rights-based approach and organizations.

Objectives:

1. Understand the history, concept and practices of right-based approach to development
2. Recognize the fundamental human rights: the national and international human rights framework applicable in the Cambodia
3. Apply appropriate rights-based tools in the programming process in development
4. Analyse the roles and value added of human rights in development strategies towards the realization of the Millennium Development Goals

Training methodology

Participatory techniques will be used during the course. Participants will actively involve in exploratory and reflective learning based on field practices which are inherent to current trends and concepts. Reflection is the core and unique foundation for the participants. The course will be conducted in Khmer with English terminology.

Each participant will receive a manual, notebook, pen and other training materials during the course. Two refreshments and lunch will be provided by LWF.

- Practitioners in key positions of ONU; INGO; NGO; a public or private services, a training or research institution working in development, advocacy and human rights.
- Participants should have basic concepts of RBA, RBA to programming, Monitoring & Evaluation, Logical framework.
